

I want to thank David Tilley for his trivia article about Corvette. Your contribution has reduced my burden for the month. Red text are links to YouTube videos.

The Name Corvette Came From a Warship.

All the American public had to do was take a look at the first Corvette, and they were sold. About 200 of them are still in existence. The Corvette was a naval vessel that was small and fast and used throughout the 1800s and 1900s.

In America, these smaller vessels were known as sloops and were employed during the War of 1812 at the Great Lakes and the Atlantic Ocean against more powerful British vessels.

#### The Rarest Corvette Was Made in 1969.

With more than 500 horsepower under its hood, the rare <u>1969 ZL-1 Corvette</u> had one of the most powerful engines. Only two of the ZL-1 Corvettes made in 1969 that were equipped with a 427 aluminum engine were sold to the public. The price tag may have had something to do with it. While a normally priced Corvette cost \$4,781 in 1969, the ZL-1 with its aluminum engine cost \$10,048 and had neither a radio nor air conditioning.

#### The Fastest Speed Clocked on a Corvette Is 212 Miles per Hour.

Tested at an oval track in Germany, the 2019 ZR1 has a 755 horsepower engine and can reach 60 mph in 2.8 seconds. Timing runs on the track were made both with and without wind, and driving with the wind, <u>the car reached 215 mph</u>. The ZRI is produced in Kentucky and comes with a price tag of \$120,000.

#### There Were no Corvettes Released in 1983.

Forty-three Corvettes were manufactured in 1983; however, all but one of them failed crash testing. <u>Only one of the 1983 Corvettes</u> was kept and is displayed in Bowling Green, Kentucky, at the National Corvette Museum. Other reports state there were a few more Corvettes produced that year, but if they were, no one knows what happened to them.

#### The Cheapest Price You Could Pay for a Corvette Was in 1954 or 1955.

The <u>1953 Corvette was built by hand</u> the first year it was manufactured, and the price tag on them that year was \$3,498. In the models produced in 1954 and 1955, assembly lines were used, lowering the cost to \$2,274 for both years. By 1962, the price tag for a Corvette was more than \$4,000 while the average cost of a home was \$12,550.

The National Corvette Museum exhibits the history of Corvette from its inception to the current year models that

leave the GM Bowling Green Assembly Plant daily. To tell the Corvette's story, the Museum utilizes their artifact and archive collections in the galleries through various model years, significant milestones, technological upgrades and its impact on the automotive world. These goals are accomplished with the help and support of enthusiasts.

## **CORVETTE PROFILES – 2005 MVB CORVETTE "NUMBER 61"**

While some Corvette owners treat their cars like royalty, driving them easy, and only in dry conditions, this cannot be said about all Corvette owners. Other Corvette owners daily drive their Corvettes, taking their Vettes through monsoons and snowstorms – like nothing can stop their Corvette driving experience.

While these daily driver Corvettes may have taken a little beating in their time, it is unlikely they have gotten to the same level of abuse as the 2005 Corvette Manufacturing Validation Build Corvette, "Number 61".



Manufacturing Validation Build (MVB) Corvettes are built prior to full public production and subjected to rigorous tests to fix problems that may occur once the car gets some miles on the drivetrain.

This MVB Corvette was one of the first for the new C6 Corvette, with VIN #00061. It was outfitted with a 4-speed automatic transmission, which was a 0-cost option for the 2005 model, and 400HP LS2 engine. The color on this Corvette is "precision red", which was only offered for the first half of the 2005 model year.

Throughout its life span from 2005-2008, this Corvette was a test car for the development of the 6-speed automatic transmissions that made its way into the 2006 and newer Corvettes.

Even though the 2005 C6 was the most technologically advanced Corvette of its time, the 4-speed automatic transmission was being pushed to its limit under the hefty power of the LS2. During testing, this car was outfitted with a more efficient 2006 6-speed automatic transmission, and later, it was outfitted with a 2008 6-speed automatic transmission, as well as the new LS3 430HP engine.

This car paved the way for the implementation of the higher gear automatics we have enjoyed in Corvettes since.

Throughout its testing, this Corvette ran on many famous racetracks around the world, including VIR, Homestead Speedway, Spring Mountain, Moroso Motorsports Park, Roebling Road, and even on the Nürburgring in Germany.
