Rumors about the mid engine continue with speculation now focused on when it will be revealed. Most sources are leaning toward the Auto Show in January 2019 in Detroit.

It's Going Racing, Possibly with V6 Power

While prototypes are out on public roads doing testing now, the racing version of the C8 [was just spotted at Road America](#) getting ready for the 2019 season. As with all Corvette race cars dating back to the C5-R, the C8.R will be built by Pratt and Miller and entered into the IMSA WeatherTech Series. A run at the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 2020 is possible, too.

Audio recorded at the track reveals that the C8.R isn't packing a V8, but rather, an engine that sounds an awful lot like the turbocharged V6 from the Ford GT. What does that mean for the road car? Who knows. IMSA has let automakers enter race cars with different engines than their road-car counterparts.

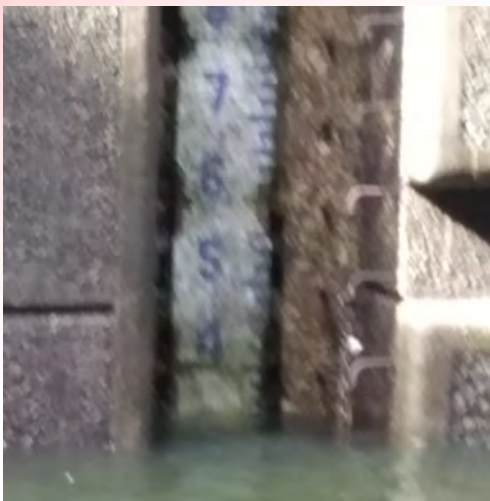
We all met in Murrells Inlet on a chilly morning for the two hour trip to Moncks Corner SC.

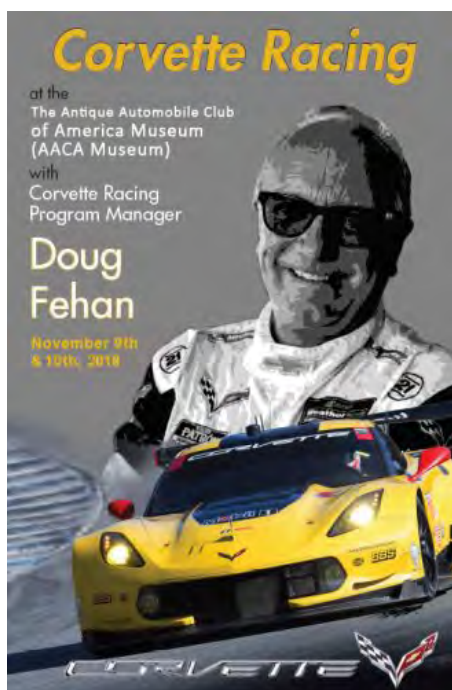

The facilities they support have limited funding by the government that barely cover clothing, food and staffing. Caleb's Dragonfly Dreams try to bridge the gap and make certain that these children have the opportunity to just be normal kids. Their volunteers provide lots of activities such as games, baking cookies, tie dying t-shirts, they buy the children birthday gifts, they attend the sporting events of the children to cheer them on and take them on a winter trip to go snow tubing and hiking over the Christmas holidays when other children are celebrating with their families.

CWC does not perform or refer for abortion but does offer information about the abortion pill. They have 2 locations, Conway and Myrtle Beach, which counsel over 850 clients a year.

HEROES FOR CHILDREN OF HORRY COUNTY

Heroes for Children is a 501C3 non-profit organization formed to support the Horry County Guardian ad Litem Program to raise awareness of the issues associated with abused, neglected and abandoned children in our community. There are approximately 300 children in the custody of the DSS at all times and approximately 80 guardians volunteering to be advocates for them. These children are in foster homes or placed with relatives and in many cases come with little clothing or possessions and can be in foster care a few months to years. Heroes for Children Guardians build relationships with the children and everyone involved in the children's life. They support children on a regular basis by supplying beds, clothing, laptops, summer camps, instruments and other such needs. These volunteers provide a stable presence in a child's life, remaining on each case until the child finds a safe, permanent home.

LITTLE RIVER MEDICAL CENTER DIABETES EDUCATION PROGRAM

Little River Medical Center is a 501C3 organization serving our community with a Diabetes Education Program designed to aid diabetic patients. They supply patients with samples of needed supplies, glucometers, test strips, and samples of insulin. They educate patients on the effects of diabetes, improving quality of life and healthy eating and exercise.

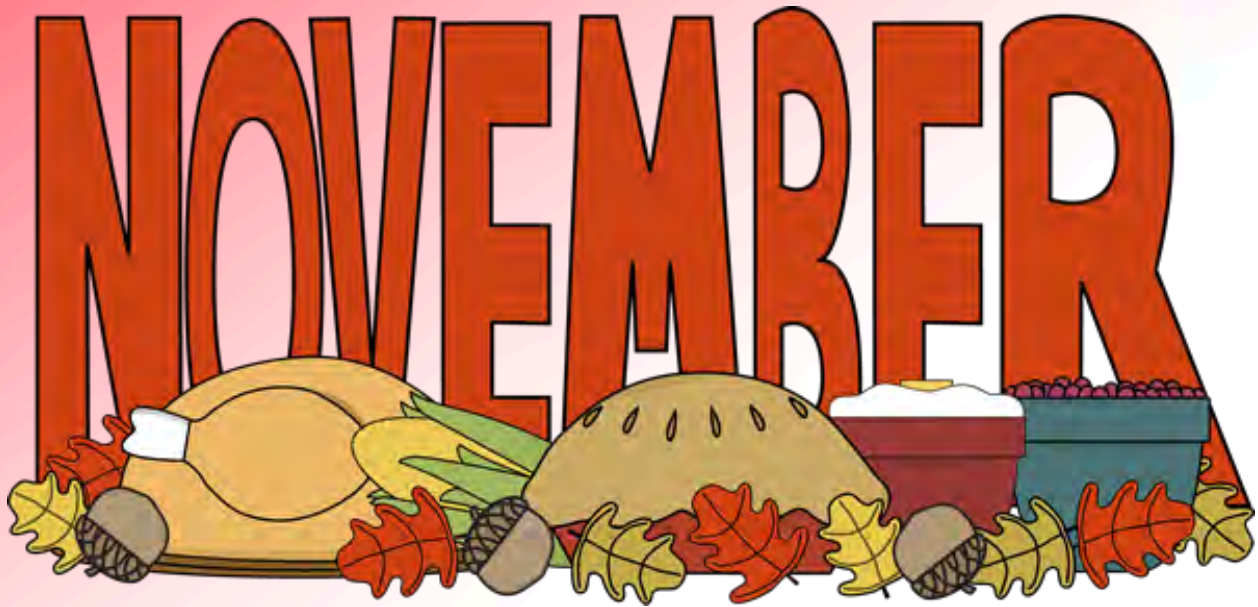

During winter cold weather they open for lunch serving soup, bread, dessert and sweet tea. There is no charge to those guests. They are currently serving dinner to approximately 75 to 80 people per night.

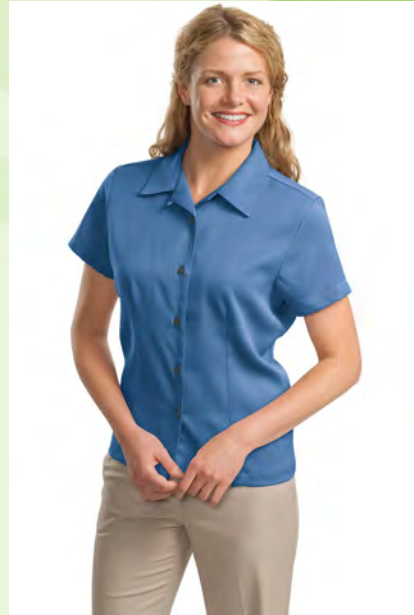
