

See ya'll at the May meeting and remember to SAVE THE WAVE.....



2019 Corvette Grand Sport to Pace 103rd Indianapolis 500

For the 16th time in history Corvette will lead the 'Greatest Spectacle in Racing.' This is the 30th time a Chevrolet product has had the honor. Corvette's first stint was in 1978, and Chevrolet's first stint dates all the way back to 1948 with a Fleetmaster Six convertible.


The Grand Sport pace car will be setup in Long Beach Red Metallic paint with dual silver stripes, eight-speed automatic, Magnetic Ride Control, Carbon Fiber Ground Effects Package and Brembo carbon ceramic brakes. With these options installed, the GS has 1.2 g cornering capabilities and

should be more than up to the task of getting through the turns at a very respectable speed.

General Motors will auction the final production seventh generation Chevrolet Corvette this summer, with the proceeds benefiting the Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation.

The announcement, along with confirmation of the Next Generation Corvette's development, was made this evening by General Motors Chairman and CEO Mary Barra, who was honored at the foundation's annual Footsteps to the Future Gala in New York.

"GM, GMC and Chevrolet support the Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation and its commitment to injured and fallen military members, first responders and their families," said Barra. "The sale of this iconic Corvette will help the foundation continue its good work, and pave the way for the Next Generation Corvette that we will introduce on July 18." The final seventh gen Corvette — a black 2019 Z06 model — will be auctioned at the Barrett-Jackson Northeast sale in Connecticut June 28. I am pleased to announce that once again, through the efforts of the Car Show Team and Bob, we have a quarter page ad in the NCM magazine "America's Sports Car". Please see page 38 of the magazine. General Motors Co. is adding 400 workers, some of whom will transfer from plants that are at risk of shutting down, to its Chevrolet Corvette factory in Kentucky that's preparing

to produce the next-generation sports car.

The largest U.S. automaker will reveal the Corvette on July 18, according to a statement Thursday. GM will be making the jobs available to existing employees, including those from plants that the company has said won't be allocated new product, according to Pat Morrissey, a spokesman.

Admission to park is \$3.25 (senior rate) per car. Pay when entering park




