Corvette Season Has Started! Sights & Sounds From The 2026 NCM Bash

The annual NCM Bash is more than just where the Museum's official Corvette season begins. Every year in April, thousands of enthusiasts migrate to Bowling Green, Kentucky, effectively turning the National Corvette Museum into the center of the Corvette world. What unfolds over these three days is more than an event—**it's an experience**. The moment the community reconnects, the cars come out, and the stories start moving again.

The Official Starting Line

The Museum positions the Bash as the opening act of its on-site season, and this year's 29th annual Michelin NCM Bash delivered on that promise with authority. A tightly packed schedule brought

together seminars, curated displays, road tours, track sessions, car shows, banquets, and rare behind-the-scenes access. This isn't a passive experience—it's immersive. Every corner of the campus is active, every building part of the story, and every attendee becomes part of something larger than a weekend gathering.

Where The Community Meets The Source

What continues to separate the Bash from every other Corvette event is access. This is where enthusiasts don't just admire the cars—**they engage with the people behind them.** Engineers, historians, and racers all share the same space, creating a rare environment where insight flows as freely as conversation. CorvSport's founder and contributor Scott Kolecki captured that energy in his [pre-event coverage](#) and followed it up on-site, connecting with readers and fellow enthusiasts during his annual visit and [book signings](#). It's that blend of familiarity and access that keeps people coming back.

As of the time you read this, there will be less than 5 weeks until the car show on June 6th, 2026, at Broadway at the Beach. Our Down South dinner party on Friday night, June 5th, 2026, will be held at the Ocean Reef Resort and that will be from 6:00 pm -10:00 pm. Online Pre-registration for the car show will be open until May 17th, 2026, and there is still plenty of time to get your cars registered for the show and to sign up for the dinner on Friday night. As of today, we only have 60 cars from MBCC registered for the show, which is less than what we had in previous years. This is the biggest fundraiser for our charities so we need your support. If you have not registered yet, please do so at your earliest convenience. There is no cost for club members, so there's no excuse.

On Car Show Saturday we need all volunteers to arrive by 7:00 am. There will be a meeting for all parking and judging volunteers and we expect cars to start arriving by 7:30 am. The tent, tables, chairs, port-a-potties, and hand washing stations will be delivered and set up on Friday morning. Cones for parking lanes will be set up Friday as well. Barricades will be set up on Thursday evening through the end of the show to keep shoppers and workers at Broadway at the Beach from parking in our designated lots.

All that are coming to the May meeting at the Giant Crab on May 3rd at 5pm, or the Car Show Committee meeting on May 5th at the N Myrtle Beach Library at 10am, or those that are volunteering at the car show, are reminded to bring a case of water. It is not unusual to have 75-100 cases of water piled up under the tent. It will be June and it will be HOT, and EVERYONE, participants and volunteers included, will need to stay hydrated. The water is free for everyone in attendance, and our volunteers on golf carts will be passing out water to everyone at the show. Golf carts will also be provided for the volunteers collecting for the 50/50, as well as any judges that need to go find cars that may have been missed. Please remember to bring hats, sunglasses and sunscreen.

As of May 1st, we have 247 cars registered for the show, 187 non-member cars

We still need more. We have approximately 127 people signed up for the dinner on Friday night, 78 MBCC members and about 49 non-members. These numbers are down from previous years, but we have plenty of time to push and get them up where they need to be. The facility will hold 200 people so we still have room for a lot more. Doors open on Friday night around 5:45pm, with hors d'oeuvres, a cash bar and a buffet dinner. The DJ starts at 6:00 pm and will play until 10:00 pm. The Friday night party is a great time, with lots of fun, music, dancing, raffles, and gift baskets, and you will have a chance to meet some of the participants that will be at the show on Saturday. More information will be shared as we get a little closer the car show. We still have about a dozen trophies that need to be sponsored, as well as the top 20 plaques. If anyone is interested in sponsoring, or knows someone that would like to sponsor trophies, please contact me as soon as possible.

I would like to personally thank all the Board of Directors for trusting me with this task, and all members of the Myrtle Beach Corvette Club that are helping as volunteers on Friday at the Dinner Party, and/or Saturday at the Car Show. I also need to show my tremendous gratitude to all those that have helped with all the donations, sponsorships, gift baskets, door prize collection, and so many other "behind-the-scenes" duties that often go unnoticed. You know who you are. I know who you are. Your efforts are not overlooked, and I truly am grateful for all of you. I certainly couldn't have done this without each and every one of you.

Member Contribution - John Grover

The Beginnings and History of the Myrtle Beach Corvette Club

The following information comes from founding members Tom Russo, Brenda Quincannon, and Bob Lang:

The original discussion on forming a Myrtle Beach Corvette Club began in the fall of 1996 with a few local Corvette owners who were friends, primarily because of their ownership of their Corvettes. At that time there was no Corvette club in the Myrtle Beach area, although we have since come to find out there apparently was an earlier generation MBCC Corvette Club but I have no information on this club regarding dates or membership. The initial discussions revolved around the rollout of the fifth generation Corvette (C5) which was scheduled for January 1997. Along with the excitement of a 5th generation C-5 Corvette was concern the National Corvette Museum was about to fold due to its inability to meet its debt obligations. According to Tom Russo, “our small Myrtle Beach Corvette owners, along with other Corvette enthusiasts from across the nation who were connected through internet forums such as Vettenet picked up on the financial difficulties of the NCM and decided to show their support by traveling to and participating in the C5 rollout set in Bowling Green at the museum in January 1997”.

From this gathering our group returned and officially the Myrtle Beach Corvette Club came into existence in January of 1997. Their first meeting was held at the Holiday Inn West, off Hwy. 501 next to the Intracoastal Waterway. According to Tom and Bob, the excitement of the C-5 rollout was the impetus for forming. “The club also developed its logo, based on its origins during the birth of the C5 generation...thus the emphasis on the C5 logo. A race themed club shirt was selected that was white with black and white squares and trimmed in red. Ladies had a “special” ladies cut shirt to match that of the guys.” Some of the founding members were Brenda & Mike Quincannon, Janie and Jim Woods, Betty & Bob Lang, Larry and Lee Parks and Tom Russo. There were about 13 car owners and approximately 20-25 members who formed MBCC as a social club. By the end of 1997 MBCC had some 40 members. The oldest club roster in my files is dated 2003 (no month). It reflects 75 family and/or individual members, and does not show a total membership count. I can write that 3 families on that roster are still members (see below). Our most current membership roster, dated August 20, 2025, was sent out to all members. Although it does not contain the total membership numbers, our March 2025 roster shows 275 total members. In dissecting that roster I found 50 families or individuals have been members longer than 4 years, which means all other members joined on or after January 1, 2021. Our longest tenured members are Debbie & Jim Sadar, who joined in May 2002. WE have 2 other families who joined in 2002, the Sansbury’s and the Grover’s.

Tom has written of the existence of a previous MBCC. He writes of the new January 1997 club members “This group knew others, including members of the former MBCC club. Its members had quit because its leadership restricted its activities to racing and not all members were into racing.” It was out of this sentiment that grew the multi-purpose mission for the re-organization of MBCC. Their interest was threefold: organize social events around the Corvette as a hobby; include events such as caravans to the NCM; and provide a forum where members could work with one another toward the maintenance and preservation of their Corvettes.” The club developed their by-laws adopted their mission of supporting children in need in Horry County. That mission statement has since changed to support club designated charities in Horry and Georgetown counties (SC) and Brunswick County (NC).

Member Contribution - John Grover

Tom recalls “Establishing the Corvettes at NASCAR became our first formal event and the first car show was held in October of 1997 at the NASCAR Café. “The goal was 60 cars and seems we had just shy of 50. It grew quickly and I recalled the goal set at 100 in year 3 or 4. We reached 90 and were ecstatic but space had become an issue.” This year, at our 26th Annual Show we had over almost 300 (?), and 26 (?) different clubs represented. Our growth has been phenomenal.

From the vision a few wonderful individuals had in 1996 to create something unique for its members and endearing throughout our community. Our donations today, and our reach in our community are so broad and impactful that I am sure even our founding members could not envision the club we have become. They would be proud.
